We plan, implement, and evaluate our process, service, and deliverables in consultation with system partners.

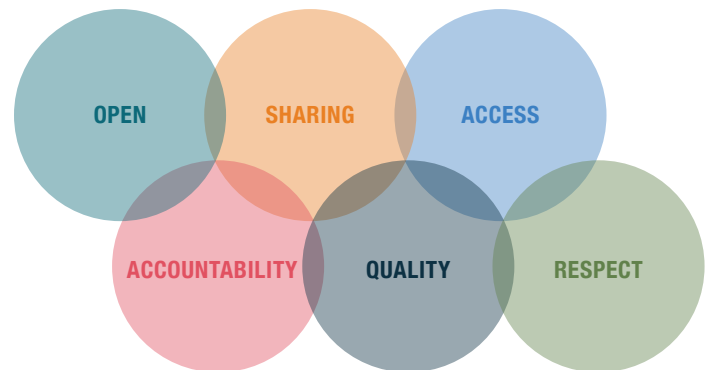
Key sources of data and input include:

- Formative and summative evaluation on project services and deliverables capturing satisfaction, value, and experience narratives

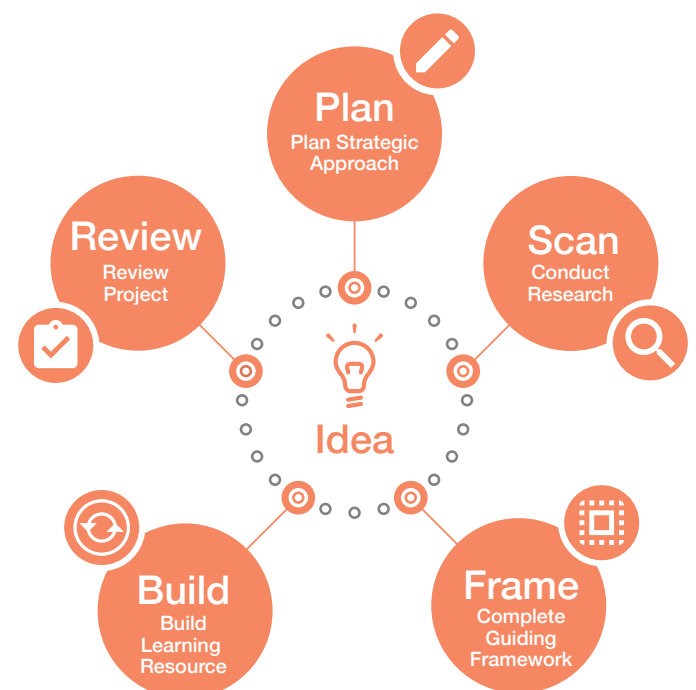
Project Framework

Projects are sponsored by the Ministry of Advanced Education, Skills and Training and can be collaborations with other ministries supporting provincial strategies, goals or post-secondary institution requests. BCcampus follows a project lifecycle that engages collaboration early and relies on evidence to make decisions during the co-creation of open educational resources (OER) and learning environments. As a neutral convener, BCcampus facilitates the opportunity for communities to share expertise, knowledge, and lived experience to inform the process and deliverables.

CURRENT PROJECTS AT-A-GLANCE

Early Years Professional Development Web Solution Pilot Project (Early Years Strategy)

Mar 2016 – Mar 2020

The collaborative design, development, and research of a hosted 3-year web solution that provides learners in the Early Years sector with searchable, upcoming professional development opportunities and curated resources will move into a transitional year. BCcampus will work is working with the Ministry of Children and Family Development to identify a host organization that can operationalize and further develop this web solution. earlyyearsbc.ca

Early Childhood Education Standards of Practice and Occupational Competencies Project

2015 – December 2019

The Early Childhood Education Standards of Practice and Occupational Competencies Project (formerly known as the Early Childhood Education Entry-to-Practice Provincial Guiding Documents Project, 2016-2017) will collaboratively develop ECE provincial standards of practice, a competency framework, and a program guide. The timeline for the project is August 2018 – August 2019 with all project resources delivered to the Steering Committee for review and approval.

Educational Electronic Health Record System Project

2018 – March 2020

This project will result in the collaborative development of an open source pilot-ready prototype and sustainability plan for an educational electronic health record system for the B.C. post-secondary education system. In support of the requirement for health professional graduates to be competent in using electronic health records in an interprofessional setting, this project was proposed by an interest group from BCIT, Douglas College, UBC, and UVIC. <https://bccampus.ca/2019/02/07/an-open-educational-tool-for-training-students-to-use-electronic-health-record-systems-in-the-workplace/>. The project committee is working to find a long term sustainable option for this pilot ready tool.

Mental Health & Substance Use Provincial Peer Training Curriculum

April 2019 to March 2021

The intent of this project is to enhance peer support program quality and consistency across the province by developing and evaluating a provincial peer training curriculum and

educational resources. Delivery of educational resources that are accessible, evidence-based, and consistent with the emerging trends in the field of mental health and addictions. Funding for this project is provided by the B.C. Ministry of Mental Health and Addictions, delivered through the Ministry of Advanced Education, Skills and Training. The deliverables include:

- Provincial Standards of Practice and Program Guide.
- Educational Resources for peer training (in-person and online).
- Evaluation and revisions to the educational resources through program delivery.

Mental Health and Wellness Projects

April 2019 – March 31, 2020

BCcampus has been engaged by the Ministry of Advanced Education, Skills and Training to work with BC's post-secondary institutions in the following areas around mental health and wellness on campus: faculty and staff training and resources; resiliency and coping workshops for students; and peer support for students. Each project will involve an advisory body to inform and guide the work being done to meet these deliverables.

Sexualized Violence and Misconduct Projects

April 2019 – March 31, 2020

The Ministry of Advanced Education, Skills and Training has engaged BCcampus to facilitate and project manage resource development and distribution around sexualized violence and misconduct for BC's post-secondary institutions including: training and student climate survey; campaign and awareness; and supports for plain language. The Ministry, through BCcampus, held a two-day forum with representatives across the province from community agencies, government, post-secondary institutions and student associations to inform next steps in preventing and responding to sexual violence and misconduct at BC PSI's.

Engineering First Year Core Curriculum Project

April 2019 – March 2020

BCcampus is working with a steering committee from the BC Engineering Articulation Committee to facilitate the curriculum development and implementation of a common set of core courses for first year engineering students in BC. This work is funded by the Ministry of Advanced Education, Skills and Training and involves grants to sending institutions for development and shepherding curriculum/course changes through their approval processes, building common course shells, and developing some open education resources.
