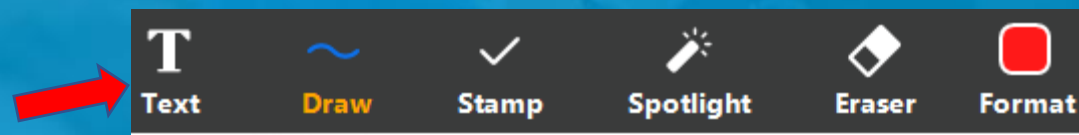

4.25 hr shifts w/ lunch, coffee break	2 hr shifts
Single day event	3-day event
30 minute interviews	30 minute interviews

Optional mock interview clinic for Engineering & Computer Science Co-op.
Business and other programs mandatory.

- Primary event host creates/manages breakout rooms
- Secondary host admits people from waiting room, chats to attendees
- Breakout rooms: set time limit vs open ended; “penalty box”
- Allow name change for students/employers
- Scatter shifts if large volume of interviews
- Career Corner a good perk
- Employers and students felt Zoom worked well!

Spark Session #2: Darelle Odo, SFU Business

- SFU Business Co-op students complete the interview workshop during the seeking term
- This summer, we had 170 seeking students and held seven 1.5 hour zoom interview workshops
- Flipped classroom style:
 - Students complete 1-2 hours of pre-reading, videos, and 3 assignments on canvas *before* the workshop
- The zoom workshop is 70% practice
 - For example, we discuss intro questions “tell me about yourself” then the students are put into breakout rooms of two to practice
 - Each practice is 6-8 minutes. 2-3 minutes to answer, 1 minute for feedback then they switch roles the interviewer becomes the interviewed
- Key takeaways:
 - Need a co-host to arrange the breakout rooms
 - Set the ground work for feedback (what worked well, what didn’t work well, what would you suggest your partner does differently next time)
 - The facilitators rotate breakout rooms
 - When possible, model answering the types of interview questions

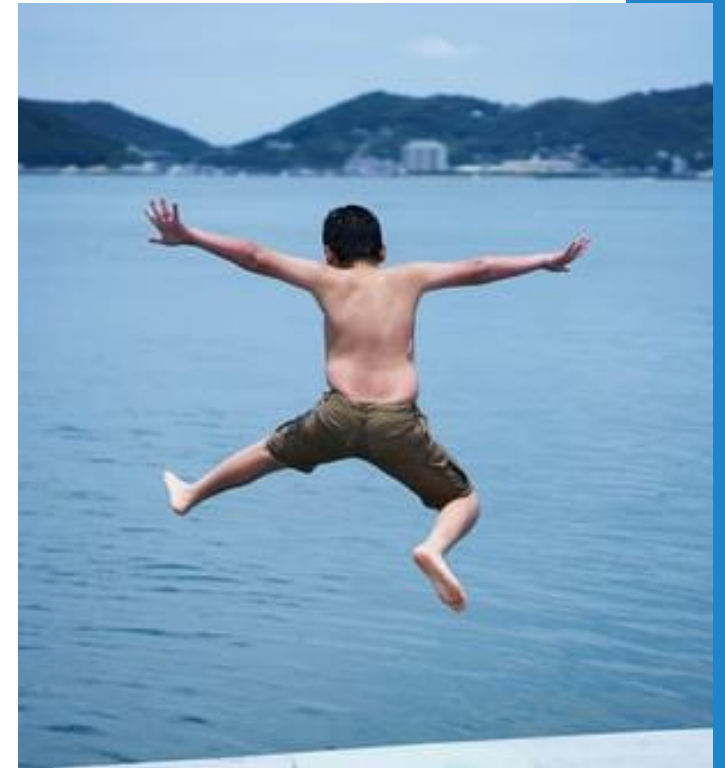
