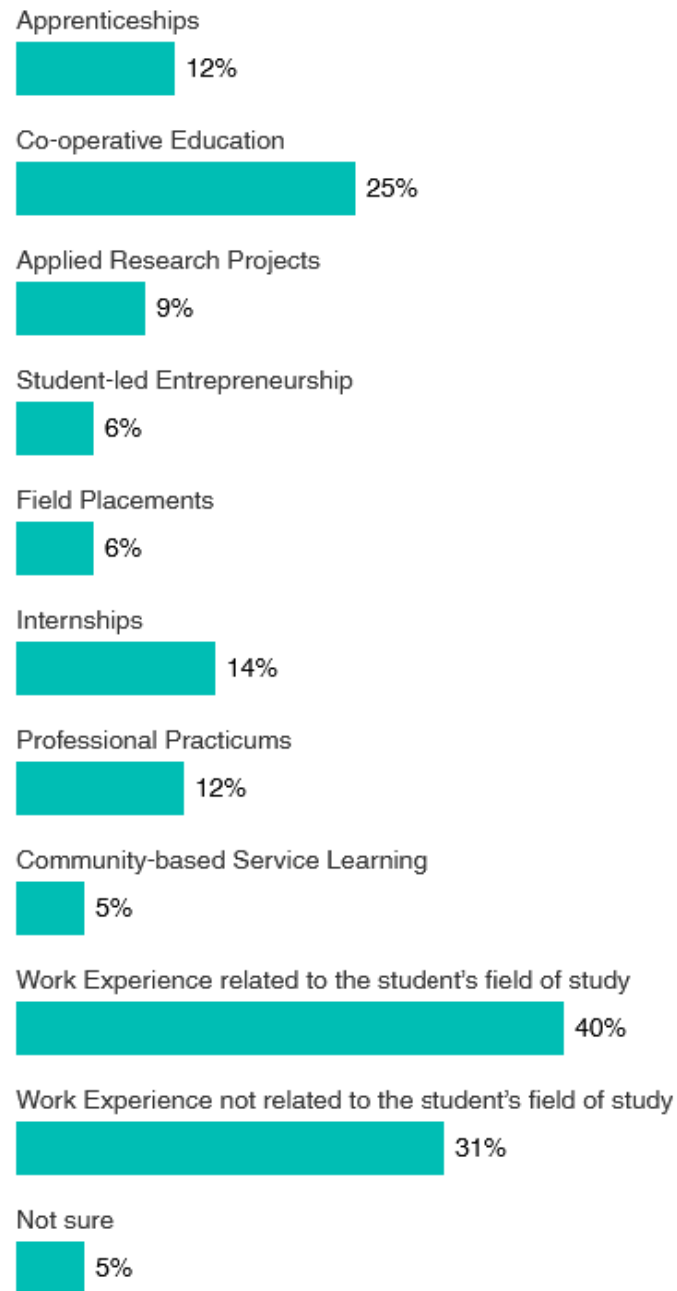

We don't want to train a student if they would only be with us temporarily



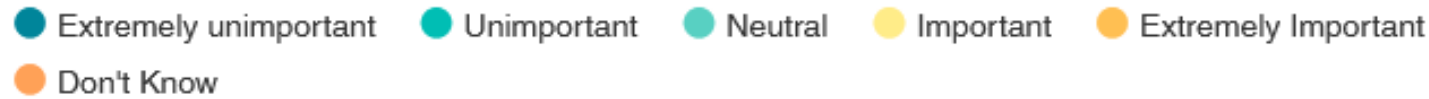

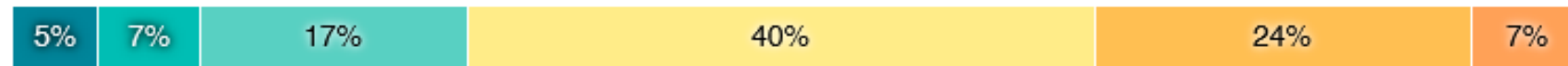
