Strength in numbers - higher enrollments


Social connections between staff and students


Marketing

Each institution does their own promotion, registration, attendance, reminder and follow up emails (with feedback mechanism)

Selkirk provides marketing templates (posters, social media tiles, wallet cards, and certificates)

North Island College provides post-event surveys and email templates

Registration

Registration closes at 9am the day before the workshop - minimum 8 participants required

Delivery

Zoom platform and accessibility requirements like closed captioning and reader technology

Promote participant engagement through breakout rooms, small and large group discussions

Interactive elements like MentiMeter and annotate feature

Delivery

Designated tech person to manage breakout rooms, videos and chat


Provide links to institution specific policies and handouts
