#### BC Federation of Students

- provincial-scale version of a local students' union
- founded in 1975
- 14 member local students' unions
- more than 170,000 individual student members
- provides advocacy, representation, and services

The Federation's primary purpose is to work for an **affordable**, **accessible**, **high quality** public postsecondary system in British Columbia, and across the country.

### The Reality of Students

- Having to work more than 2 jobs to support themselves.
- Living in precarious housing situations.
- Avoiding purchasing mandatory school materials due to high cost.
- Students' Union food banks are seeing an increase in usage.
- Students have diversified: mature students, international students, trades students, parents pursuing their education and more!

#### The Issue

- Tuition fees have skyrocketed for the last two decades doubling since 2001.
- Students in BC are graduating with an average debt of \$29,000.
- Tuition fees make up just over 50% of the operating budget of institutions.
- Government funding now contributes **only 40%** of funding to institutions as compared to 80% in the 1980s.
- Over-reliance on international student tuition fees by institutions to make up for gaps in government funding.

# Fund It, Fix It Campaign Goal

- to increase funding to post-secondary institutions and secure a progressive funding model that accounts for inflation.
- to immediately freeze, then progressively reduce tuition and other user fees.



#### Students Working Together Gets Results

**1989:** no GST on tuition and residence fees

**1992, 1996-2000:** tuition fee freezes

2000-01: tuition fee reduction

2004: 2% cap on tuition fee increases, annually

2005: international students work off campus

**2004-current:** re-regulation of tuition and ancillary fees

**2007-2014:** tuition fee-free adult basic education (ABE)

2008: Canada's first national system of grants

2017: interest on student loans reduction

2017: tuition fee-free ABE & English Language Learning

**2018:** \$250,000 funding for open education resources for ABE

2019: interest eliminated on BC student loans

interest on federal student loans reduction

\$3.26 million funding for open education resources

2020: BC Access Grant (\$41 million annually)

**2022:** interest eliminated on federal student loans

**2023:** Increase to Canada Student Grant up to \$4200
