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



### **CEL at UVic**



Community-Engaged Learning (CEL) is essentially experiential learning WITH community.

Students actively engage with course content through a combination of collaborations with community and facilitated critical reflection.

## **CEL** as Expansive



### **Spectrum of Engagement**

#### Inform

Students interact with community partners through the exchange of knowledge

#### Consult

research or project support for community partners

#### Involve

Students
participate in
community
partner
endeavours

#### Collaborate

Students and/or faculty develop and implement mutual projects with community partners

#### Co-Create

Faculty and community partners co-create, co-deliver and co-evaluate community-engaged learning

Low engagement and simple reciprocity

High engagement and complex reciprocity


















## **Guiding Principles in CEL**




### Finding Alignment



There many considerations to make when planning effective and aligned collaborations, including:

- Community partner needs, interests and mentorship capacity
- Student's level of skill, knowledge, interest, experience and maturity
- Instructor's experience, knowledge, interest (e.g. alignment with research) and available time
- Course learning outcomes
- The relationship between students, instructors and community





## **Two Types of Virtual CEL**





- Class-time is virtual, but community-engaged elements of the course can happen in person in the student's community.
- All elements of the course, including communityengaged elements are virtual.
