- Global Nonprofit, started in 2001
 Global standard for open licenses
- On over 2.5B works online
- We believe in a world where education, culture, and science are equitably shared to benefit humanity.

CC CERTIFICATE COURSES

- Develop expertise in copyright, the public domain, open licensing and the ethos of open movements in our global, shared commons
- Courses offered every January, June, and September
- Access to copyright lawyers, open advocates, accessibility coaches, group discussions, 1:1 support from a CC expert
- 25:1 ratio
- Open pedagogy approach



CC CERTIFICATE COURSES

- Time commitment: 6-10 hrs per week for 10 weeks online, or a 40 hr, week-long "bootcamp" in person
- Anyone can enroll but courses are for (1) Academic Librarians, (2) Educators, and (3) Cultural Heritage communities

- Co-Chair of the Open Education Working Group

- Nuances of ShareAlike and NonCommercial restrictions and conditions
- Differences between collections and adaptations
- How licenses might be misunderstood / dispelling myths and misconceptions
- How to advocate for OE

- Ideas for teaching

- New OE portfolio
- Support OER grant funded projects
- Provide CC and OER workshops



- Assignments that can be used outside the course as well




